August is Immunization Awareness Month! As such TRPHD would like to remind you why you and your family should get vaccinated!

- It is always better to prevent a disease than to treat it after it occurs.
- Vaccination is a highly effective, safe and easy way to help keep your family healthy.
- On-time vaccination throughout childhood is essential because it helps provide immunity before children are exposed to potentially life-threatening diseases.
- Vaccines are tested to ensure that they are safe and effective for children to receive at the recommended ages.

- Hib: Haemophilus Influenza B
- Phv: Human Papillomavirus

- IPV:: Polio
- Men ACWY: Meningococcal A, C, W, Y
- Men B: Meningococcal B
- MMR: Measles, Mumps, Rubella
- MMRV: measles, Mumps, Rubella, and Varicella
- PCV: Pneumococcal
- Tdap: Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis
- Varicella: Chickenpox

A fun fact about Jesse? Even though Jesse is all about numbers now, he wasn't always. In fact Jesse used to participate in musicals, plays, and choir.



Vaccines are recommended for pregnant women, and individuals over 65. Check with your primary care provider or pharmacy to receive your vaccine today.





In addition to vaccine administered to mothers, injections are available for infants and young children. They provide an extra layer of defense that helps fight RSV infections and protect children from getting very sick.






Car Seat Safety!
